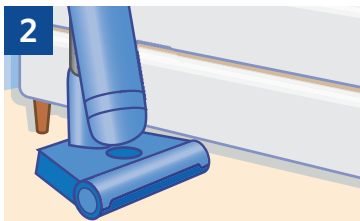

Step 1: Remove launderable fabrics

Start your regular turnover cleaning process by removing used bed linens and towels.

Step 2: Vacuum soft furniture

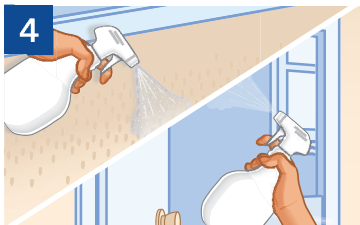
For soft furniture such as couches, chairs and padded headboards, use a vacuum to remove invisible smoke particles.

Step 3: Deodorize soft furniture

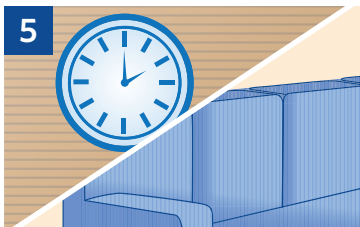

Step 4: Deodorize air and carpets thoroughly
